Holiday Season and End of Year 2011

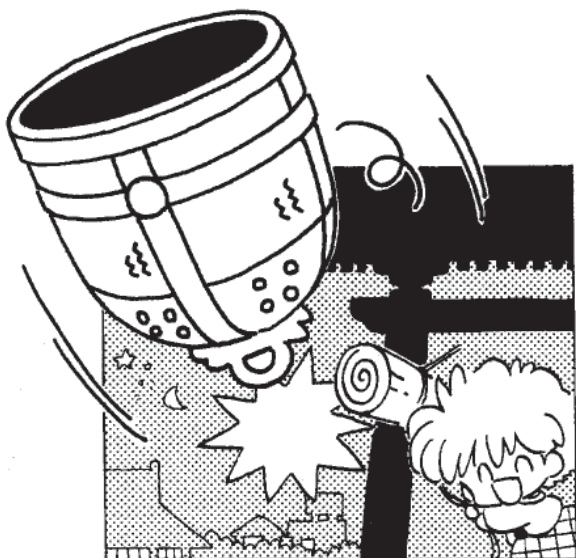
Dear Members and Friends,

The highlight for us, Hongwanji members, was the 750th memorial of Shinran Shonin, our founder. Undaunted by the earthquake and tsunami scare in north Japan shortly before the memorial service, Jikoen members and Hawaii Betsuin, Wahiawa and Kamuela Hongwanji members braved the "storm" and participated wholeheartedly in all of the events, including the 14th World Buddhist Women's Convention. "Once in a lifetime experience," "speechless," "overflowing gratitude," "inspirational," "educational," "honored," "humbled," "unforgettable," "memorable," "total transformational"...these are the words uttered by participants but words could not truly convey the deep emotional and spiritual highs that were experienced. We were truly grateful for having had the opportunity to observe this once-in-a-lifetime observance since the next memorial, the 800th, will not take place until another 50 years.

Dr. Albert Miyasato Memorial Seminar is another unforgettable event which we, Shin Buddhists, participated in, this year. This is a biennial event in memory of one of our leaders of Hongwanji as well as a leader of the larger community. Dr. Miyasato uttered three words shortly before his death, to the former Bishop Yosemite: *wasureruna* – do not forget; *uketsuge* – carry on; *tsutaeyo* – pass on the legacy to the future generation. Inspired by these three words we at Jikoen established this special seminar with invited guest leaders or mentors.

With these spiritual experiences encountered this past year of 2011, let us be grateful for the immeasurable light of wisdom and compassion of Amida Buddha that surrounds us without fail. Ministers' Bodhi Day Walk for Peace

On Bodhi Day, December 8, 2011, fourteen ministers from the Honolulu and Oahu districts will participate in a unique activity to help raise funds for the Pacific Buddhist Academy's capital building fund. They will walk over 5½ miles from Moiliili Hongwanji on University Avenue to Jikoen Hongwanji in Kalihi, with a stopover at the Hawaii Betsuin on Pali Highway.

The ministers have been collecting pledges from temple members and the community, with all of the proceeds going to PBA.

The Rev. Richard Tennes of Hawaii Betsuin, one of the organizers of the event said, "We ministers have decided to make this symbolic pilgrimage to express our support for PBA's mission of nurturing mindful and compassionate human beings. Young people who have internalized the values of Buddhism – compassion, tolerance and a seeking spirit – are our true hope for the future."

Bishop's Message: Life-Shaping Encounters

Bishop Eric Matsumoto recounts all the important experiences in his life that have shaped his life – his grandmother's and parents' support and guidance, his teachers and mentors in Japan, the contacts with other ministerial candidates, and Hawaii Kyodan's financial help for his studies in Kyoto. All these experiences spanned many, many years, he professes.

Now he wonders if the time he spent could have been shorter and more integrated. The answer, he believes, is the Pacific Buddhist Academy, which today offers not only a sound academic foundation for its students, but might afford the young people a chance to in a short four years the same type of experiences he encountered in his youth – immersion in Buddhist-based perspectives, visiting Japan, meeting would-be mentors, etc.

“The Buddha-Dharma has always been about making a difference, about changing for the better, but it all starts with attitudes and perspectives. For a brighter future, I am convinced that we all, Buddhist and non-Buddhists alike, should avail ourselves to be guided by Wisdom and inspired by Compassion and PBA is one way that we can provide that exposure and experience of the Buddha, Dharma and Sangha to the youth of Hawaii...”
